- 1. What are some things that you have faith in?
- 2. What are some things that you struggle to have faith in?

Genesis 12:10-20 - Now there was a famine in the land, and Abram went down to Egypt to live there for a while because the famine was severe. ¹¹ As he was about to enter Egypt, he said to his wife Sarai, "I know what a beautiful woman you are. ¹² When the Egyptians see you, they will say, 'This is his wife.' Then they will kill me but will let you live. ¹³ Say you are my sister, so that I will be treated well for your sake and my life will be spared because of you." ¹⁴ When Abram came to Egypt, the Egyptians saw that Sarai was a very beautiful woman. ¹⁵ And when Pharaoh's officials saw her, they praised her to Pharaoh, and she was taken into his palace. ¹⁶ He treated Abram well for her sake, and Abram acquired sheep and cattle, male and female donkeys, male and female servants, and camels. ¹⁷ But the LORD inflicted serious diseases on Pharaoh and his household because of Abram's wife Sarai. ¹⁸ So Pharaoh summoned Abram. "What have you done to me?" he said. "Why didn't you tell me she was your wife? ¹⁹ Why did you say, 'She is my sister,' so that I took her to be my wife? Now then, here is your wife. Take her and go!" ²⁰ Then Pharaoh gave orders about Abram to his men, and they sent him on his way, with his wife and everything he had.

- 3. Abram was following God, and yet still experienced famine where God had led him. How do you think this might have impacted Abram's faith?
- 4. In verse 12 we see that Abram was afraid that the Egyptians would kill him, why do you think that Abram forgot God's promise to make him into a great nation? (Genesis 12:2)
- 5. Abram deceived the Egyptians to protect himself. In what ways are you tempted to not tell the whole truth in order to avoid a negative or gain a positive?
- 6. Abram benefitted financially from the Egyptians as a result of his deception. How do you think this might have impacted him in the future?
- 7. Abram trusted God enough to leave his homeland and go where God would send him. Why do you think he was unable to trust God when he went to Egypt?
- 8. How does not trusting or obeying God make a difference?
 - How does our choice to not trust God impact us and our relationship with God?
 - How does our choice to not trust God impact those closest to us?
 - How does our choice to not trust God impact those around us at work, in our neighborhood, etc.
- 9. Why do you think that Abram didn't learn from his sin in Genesis 12? (See Genesis 20)
- 10. What helps you to faith by faith with God?
- 11. Pastor Bill said that walking by faith means making decision with God. What does that mean?
- 12. What does making decisions with God look like for you? How do you do it?
- 13. What areas of life does God give us freedom to choose in?
- 14. What areas does God give us specific direction?
- 15. God is always faithful. How does that help you to follow Him?
- 16. What promise of God is encouraging for you?
- 17. What area in your life would you like God's direction in?
- 18. How can you remind yourself to walk by faith and seek God's direction in decisions?
