Matthew 5:10-12 - "Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 11 "Blessed are you when people insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. 12 Rejoice and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great; for in this same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

The eighth beatitude is different from the previous seven. The first seven we are to pursue, but persecution is not something we seek, but rather the result of living out the first seven beatitudes.

- 9. How do you see the world today hating Jesus?
- 10. Pastor Guy mentioned that since Jesus' death more than 75 million people have been killed or martyred for their faith in Jesus and more than half of those have been killed in the past 100 years. Does this surprise you? Why or why not?
- 11. Why do you think that people continue to proclaim Jesus even in places where they might be killed for it?
