The Jesus Difference – Week 5 – 3-5-23 – Pastor Guy

- 1. What are some of the most impactful relationships that you have had in life?
- 2. Share your marital status and how God has worked in your life in that status?
- 3. Pastor Guy said that if Jesus is not making a difference in your relationships, it is because you have not let Jesus into that area. What are your thoughts about this?

Ephesians 5:21-33 - ²¹ Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. ²² Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. ²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything. ²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶ to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. ²⁸ In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed and care for their body, just as Christ does the church— ³⁰ for we are members of his body. ³¹ "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh." ³² This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church. ³³ However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

- 5. Why do you think that God calls for us to submit to one another?
- 6. How was the challenge for wives to submit to their husbands and for husbands to love their wives revolutionary for the time it was written?
- 7. Pastor Guy mentioned that before Adam & Eve sinned they were both co-regents, or co-rulers of the earth. How did this dynamic change after the fall?

Genesis 3: 16b - Your desire will be for your husband, and he will rule over you."

- 8. How did sin impact God's plan for marriage?
- 9. How does sin impact marriage (and all relationships) today?
- 10. In what ways is Jesus' view of relationships in general contrary to how we want to live?

Galatians 3:28 - There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

- 11. If we are all one in Christ, why do you think that God gives specific instructions for husbands, wives, children, parents, slaves, masters, etc.?
- 12. Pastor Guy mentioned that every relationship is on a slanted plane, and takes energy to move it forward. What are your thoughts about this analogy?
- 13. What are some specific things that you can do to move your relationships forward?
- 14. Where do you look for help in relationships?
- 15. What does it mean to have Jesus at the center of your relationships?
