- 1. Are you naturally a forgiving person?
- 2. How many times should we forgive someone for the same offense?
- 3. What's the hardest part of forgiving someone?

Matthew 18:21-22 - Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?"<sup>22</sup> Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.

- 4. Jewish law said to forgive 2 or at most 3 times. How do you think this statement by Jesus, to forgive 77 or (7 X 70 times), would have come across to the hearers?
- 5. What do you think Jesus' point was in making this statement?

Matthew 18:23-35 - <sup>23</sup> "Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. <sup>24</sup> As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him. <sup>25</sup> Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. <sup>26</sup> "At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' <sup>27</sup> The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go. <sup>28</sup> "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded. <sup>29</sup> "His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.' <sup>30</sup> "But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. <sup>31</sup> When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened. <sup>32</sup> "Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. <sup>33</sup> Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?' <sup>34</sup> In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed. <sup>35</sup> "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart.".

- 7. Jesus begins this story by saying that, "the kingdom of heaven is like". How is the kingdom of heaven like this king?
- 8. How important do you think that forgiveness to God?
- 9. What are your thoughts about how the master responded to the servant?
- 10. How is God like the master in this story?
- 11. Verse 35 says that God will treat those who don't forgive from the heart like the master treated the wicked servant. What are your thoughts about this?
- 12. The master in this story forgave the equivalent of 8 billion dollars in gold, the servant wouldn't forgive the equivalent of \$15,000 in silver. What lesson was Jesus making in this story?
- 13. How much has God forgiven you?
- 14. What did that forgiveness cost?
- 15. How does the debt of your sin to God compare to the debt of others sins against you?
- 16. Who is God calling you to forgive? What will you do this week to move that direction?
