
Summary

Pastor Guy continues the series called 'The Benefits of Doubt', exploring how doubt interacts with faith. Using Matthew 28, He discusses how even some of Jesus' followers doubted when they saw him after the resurrection, yet Jesus still gave them the Great Commission. On the whiteboard Pastor Guy introduces a framework for faith that includes formation, testing, and potential paths toward either deconstruction/deconversion or reconstruction, emphasizing that doubt can be a path to deeper faith when handled properly.
